DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES:

This position is located in the Security Police functional area of an ANQ Wing/Group Flying Activity which has an alert mission. Its primary purpose is to provide physical protection of assigned aircraft and other priority resources. An additional purpose is to assist in maintaining law and order and in preserving the peace. As assigned, the incumbent may also function as the Communicator/Plotter and Alarm monitor. Patrols restricted areas on a rotational basis OP serves in fixed posts to provide close-in, close boundary, and perimeter protection of the unit's alert aircraft, non-alert aircraft, and/or other priority resources from the dangers of sabotage, espionage, armed intrusion and other willful OF accidental destruction.

-- At fixed posts, controls access and departure of personnel to the highly restricted area immediately surrounding the alert aircraft, which is limited to the alert aircrew. Ensures positive identification of aircrew members who request access to the controlled area through review of authorizing documents and identification papers or use of appropriate passwords. Ensures that other personnel requiring access are vouched for and escorted by authorized aircrew members.-- Patrols perimeters of ramps by vehicle and ensures that only authorized personnel ape within the controlled perimeter area. Remains alert to unusual conditions and/or unauthorized personnel, and immediately investigates to determine the causes of such abnormal conditions to include on-the-spot assessment of the situation. If non-hostile in nature, apprehends and, within jurisdictional limitations,

interrogates unauthorized personnel, conducting searches as necessary and warranted .-- Participates in such base defense functions as mobility exercises and ground-based war games in preparation for deploymentand/or local hostilities. Participates in offensive and defensive tactical postures in neutralizing threats. apprehending armed intruders, etc.-- On a rotating basis, participates in base mobile patrols of the ANQ grounds for the purpose of maintaining law and order and of providing support to the base security police personnel in law enforcement activities pertaining to the information security, personnel security, and resource protection programs. Maintains continual surveillance over the areas being protected. noting the movement of persons, vehicles, and any other items which might be significant OF critical in view of the size and type of population within the local area and overall access to the installation. Investigates situations which differ from the normal (e.g., an unlocked door, a power failure, an abandoned vehicle) which might be indicators of a significant security incident. As deemed necessary, stops and questions suspicious persons; advises them of their rights; conducts searches of persons or property within the bounds of Jurisdictional limitations; seizes. collects, and preserves evidence; and coordinates with the host base security personnel (if and as applicable) on the detention and/or arrest of violators. -- As assigned. stands watch on main or ancillary gate providing access to the base or other controlled-access area. Checks personal identification and/or vehicular registration and permits or denies access a~ appropriate in accordance with standing instructions.—Drives patrol vehicles, operates radio and other communications equipment, and prepares reports of security activities and incidents. Initiates up-channel reporting in the identification of hostile and non-hostile activities. May assume the duties of the shift supervisor in his/her absence. -- Participates as required in such special security assignments as crowd control or reserve security duties in cases of visiting dignitaries or government officials depending on the nature and type of traffic at the ANG Base or the host airport/airfield. -- As assigned, operates the central security control as the primary or alternate command post for security operations. Operates the communicator/plotter console; maintains the base/adjacent area plotting boards, the normal and emergency security operations checklists, required records and logs, the Security Police Desk Blotter and chronological records of security activities: initiates up-channel USAF security reporting/alerting procedures and receives and implements down-channel alerts; maintains landline or radio communications with each posted sentry, mobile patrol, and security alert team; and operates the intrusion alarm systems and controls entry into alarmed areas.

--Performs other duties as assigned

GENERAL ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Must meet requirements as stated in the "Areas of Consideration".
- 2. Enlisted personnel must possess an AFSC compatible with the MPCN upon selection for military duty.
- 3. Not be eligible for, nor be receiving, an immediate Federal (Military or Civilian) retirement annuity.
- 4. Any individual selected for a military duty tour must, at the time of entry on military duty, be eligible to serve 5 consecutive years in the AGR Program prior to eligiblity for military non-disability retirement or retainer pay.
- 5. A member selected for full-time military duty tour must have sufficient retainability to complete 20 years of Active Federal Service prior to mandatory separation date (MSD) for officers; age 60 for enlisted members.
- 6.Any member in the fitness improvement program (FIP) is ineligible for entry into any type of AGR or statutory tour.
- 7. Member currently in the AGR program must meet the requirements as stated in ANGI 36-101, The Active Guard/Reserve Program and ANGI 36-2002, Enlistment Reenlistment in the Air National Guard.
- 8. Must be able to obtain a security clearance if required for the grade and duty position of assignment within one year.
- 9 Indivdual selected must perform all duties and conform to hours of duty as determinded by the Commander. Individuals selected in lieu of a military technician position must perform all duties as described in the technician position description.
- 10. Except for mobilization or other emergency, member accepted for tour will not be subject to permanent change of duty station without their consent. Contunuance of tour is subject to satisfactory duty performance.
- 11. Existing Iowa ANG Promotion policies apply.
- 12. Subject to program contunuance, member succesfully completeing initial tour will be afforded priority for tour extension (renewal).
- 13. It is mandatory that the appropriate Military Uniform be worn.
- 14. Release from Active Duty prior to completion of tour is contingent upon approval of the Adjutant General of Iowa.
