ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS TO BE CONSIDERED FOR THIS POSITION

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS:

1. Not currently "Flagged from Favorable Personnel Actions" or under a "Bar to Reenlistment."
2. Must be or be able to complete 92F MOSQ within 12 months of assignment.
3. Must be able to meet the required service obligation (minimum of 12 months from course completion).
4. A Soldier who has a remaining contractual service obligation due to an incentive contract for a specific MOS or UIC may apply for M-Day vacancies but will lose remaining incentive payments with the possibility of recoupment, as applicable.
5. Must not be currently stagnant on NCOES/PME.
6. Soldiers command removed or self-removed from promotion consideration are not eligible to apply.

MOS SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS:

1. A physical demands rating of Significant (Gray).
2. PULHES: 211221.
3. Normal color vision.
4. Per AR 600-8-19, promotion to MSG and SGM requires an interim secret eligibility or higher.
5. A minimum score of 86 in aptitude area CL and 85 in aptitude area OF.
6. A minimum OPAT score of Standing Long Jump (LJ) – 0140 cm, Seated Power Throw (PT) – 0400 cm, Strength Deadlift (SD) – 0140 lbs., and Interval Aerobic Run (IR) – 0040 shuttles in Physical Demand Category in "Significant" (Gray).
7. Completion of MOS 92F course conducted under the auspices of the U.S. Army Quartermaster School); or meet ACASP listed in AR 601-210. Waiver requests can be submitted to the Office of the Quartermaster Commandant Enlisted Proponent Office at USARMY Ft Lee, VA, 23801. SUMMARY OF DUTIES:

The petroleum supply specialist receives, stores, and issues petroleum products, operates and maintains petroleum equipment, and performs quality control tests on fuel and lubricant. Provide refuel support for vehicles and aircraft, conduct bulk-to-bulk transfers, and manage fuel inventories, while also ensuring compliance with environmental and safety regulations to support unit operations and maintain equipment.

1. Perform petroleum quality control testing, analyzing fuel samples and interpret results. Manage petroleum distribution operations, oversee tank farms and issue points. Maintain accurate inventory records and prepare detailed reports on fuel consumption and stockage levels. Troubleshoot and repair petroleum distribution equipment, ensure operational readiness. Train and mentor junior petroleum specialists, enforce safety regulations and proper procedures. Inspect and evaluate petroleum storage facilities, identify and correct deficiencies. Coordinate fuel requests and deliveries, ensure timely support for operational requirements.

*If ASVAB line scores are not listed on the STP, supporting document must be included such as DD 1966 or DMDC 680.

Application Instructions:

Documents need to be scanned as **one PDF**; PDF Portfolios will not be accepted.

Packets should be labeled by vacancy number and last name i.e. **MDV #26-001 Snuffy.**

Applications must be received by the Enlisted Personnel Management (EPM) team no later than 1630 on the closing date of announcement. Incomplete or late packets will not be accepted.

Packets not scanned as one document will be returned without action.**
